KANSAS JUNIOR AMERICAN CITIZEN TIMELINE

JULY – CHECK NSDAR FOR THE NEW THEME. Make handouts for teachers/leaders. Members can work with a child or family members and count as entries.

AUGUST - Send contest information to schools, teachers, scout leaders, home school coops, churches, family participants and 4-H clubs. This can be done electronically or by hard copy.

SEPTEMBER – Continue distributing information and follow-up with previous mailings.

OCTOBER – Contact all participants and remind them of the chapter deadline and if they have any questions.

NOVEMBER - Check in with participants at least twice about the chapter deadline and arrange for pickup. Remind leaders to, (**Make Sure JAC Contest Entry Form Is Legible and Complete.**)

DECEMBER - Pickup entries by the last school day before Christmas break. Judge chapter entries and give certificates to chapter winners. Chapter chairs should retain the original entry for first place in each category **then send digital copies of the first place winners to State Chair by December 20th, 2024.**

JANUARY – Make chapter certificates for all participants.

National winner, chapter chairs will be notified. • Present JAC Certificates of Award to first place chapter winners. Consider acknowledging second, third, and honorable mention winners. Certificates are available on the Kansas SIP under JAC.

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FEBRUARY/MARCH/APRIL/MAY - Distribute
