Rebecca joined the DAR in 1969 as a Junior member of the Nodaway Chapter in Maryville, Missouri. In 1980, Rebecca became an organizing officer of the Prairie Rose Chapter, Overland Park, Kansas. She is a 50+ member of DAR, has served on numerous national committees, including National Chair, Women’s Issues Committee, campaign teams and was elected to Vice President/Chaplain of the National State Vice Regents Club.

At the state level, Rebecca was the Kansas Outstanding Junior in 1986. She served as KSDAR Vice Regent, State Historian and State Corresponding Secretary.
