Project:

The United States stands on the threshold of its 250th birthday in 2026 and Kansas Daughters will, if permission is received, have the special honor of placing an America 250 Our Patriots marker at the Nicodemus National Park in Nicodemus, Kansas, to honor the legacy of the first settlers of Nicodemus in their quest for liberty. Should permission not be granted, this proposal affords the Executive Committee the authority to designate an alternate location.
